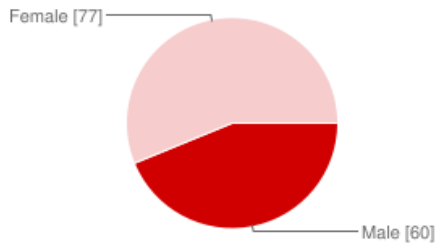

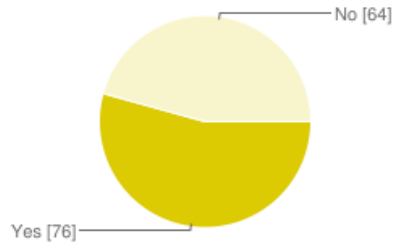

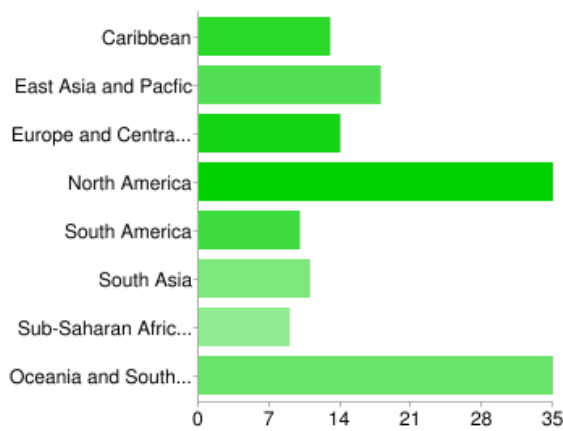

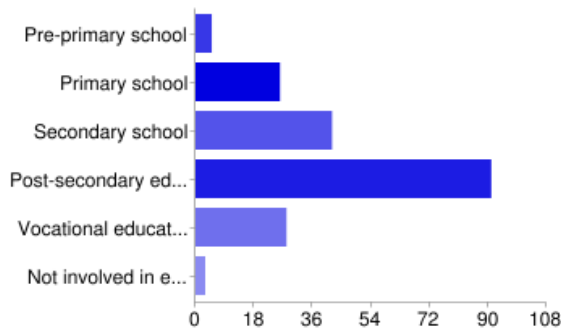

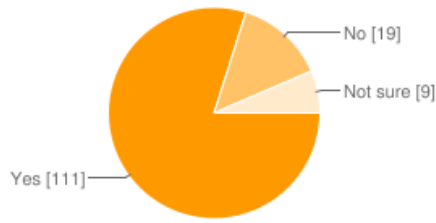
**6. If your work is specifically education-related, what is your main focus?**

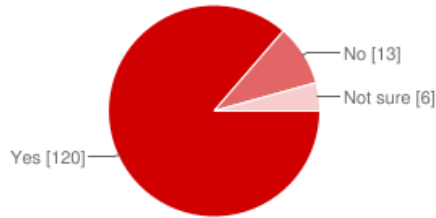

**7. Prior to joining this course, did you know about the concept of "open education resources" (OER)?**



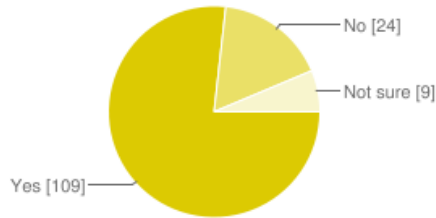

**8. Prior to joining this course, did you know of Creative Commons licenses or "open content licensing"?**



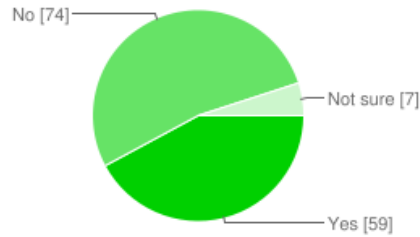

**9. Have you used / reused Creative Commons licensed content before? (e.g. images, audio, video, text)?**



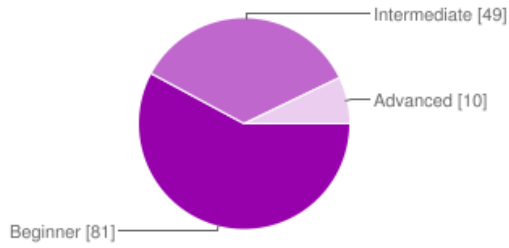

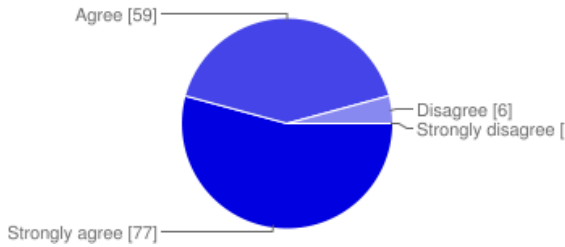

**11. How would you rate your knowledge of the different Creative Commons licenses?**



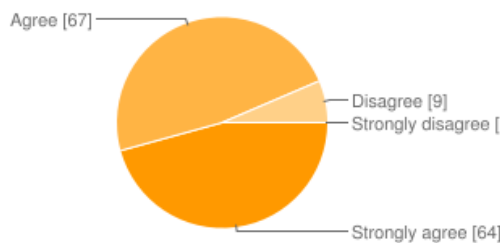

**12. Learning materials should be free for all learners of the world.**



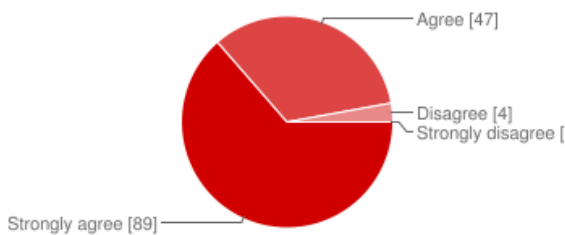

**13. Lecturers, teachers and trainers should share their teaching materials freely.**



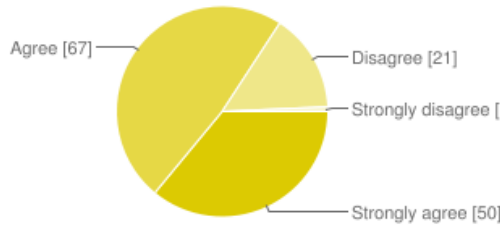

**14. Content generated from taxpayer revenue should be released freely for use by everyone.**



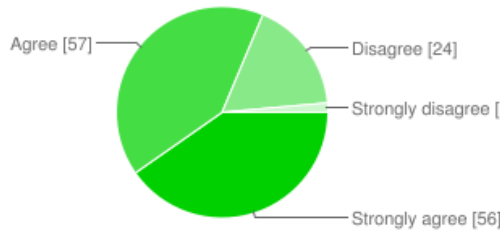

**15. It is fair and reasonable for educators to have unrestricted permissions to copy materials for teaching and learning contexts.**



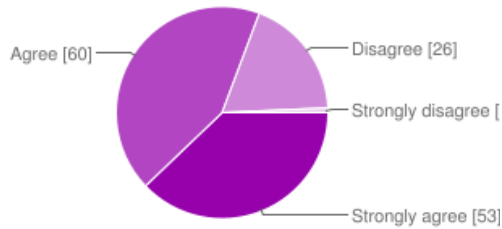

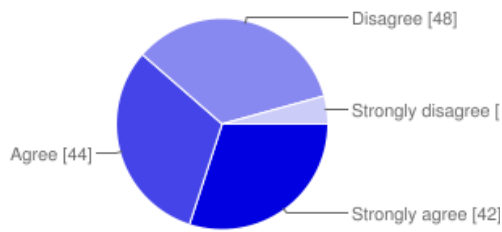

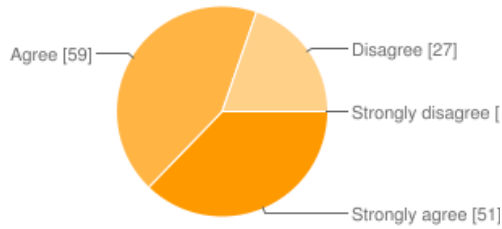

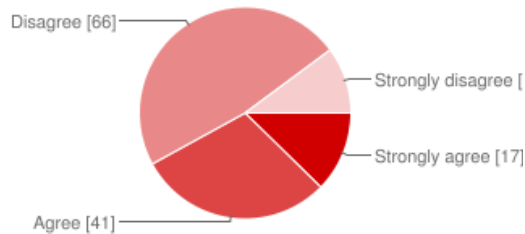

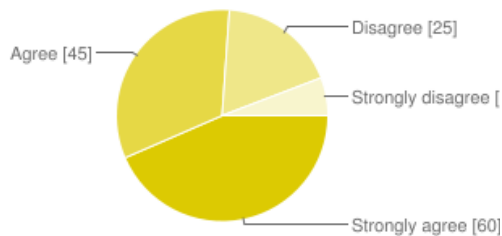

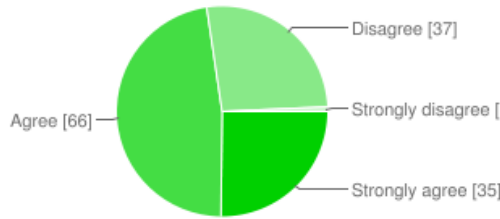

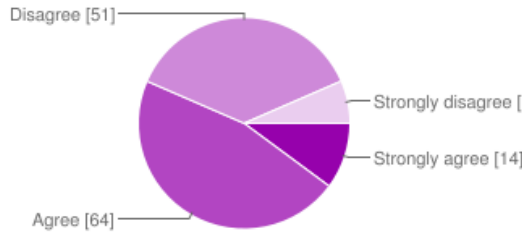

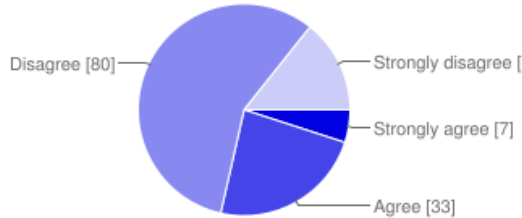

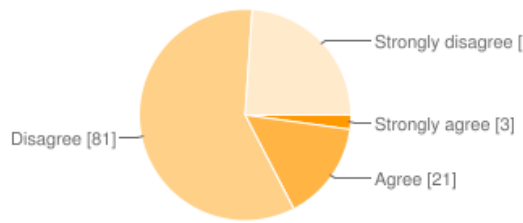

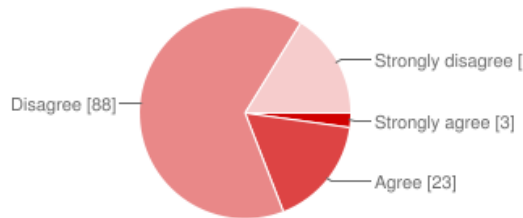

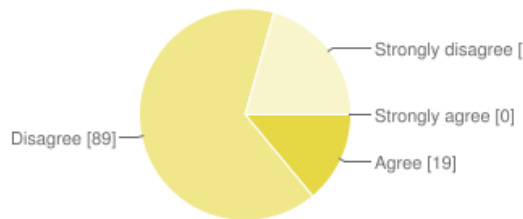

**26. I am reluctant to share my teaching materials or creative works BECAUSE I don't have time to do so.**



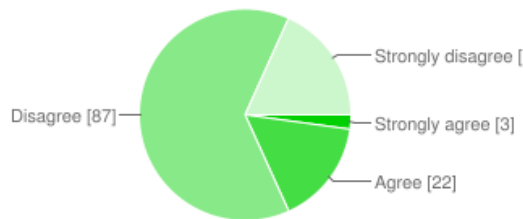

**27. I am reluctant to share my teaching materials or creative works BECAUSE there are no incentives for me to do so.**



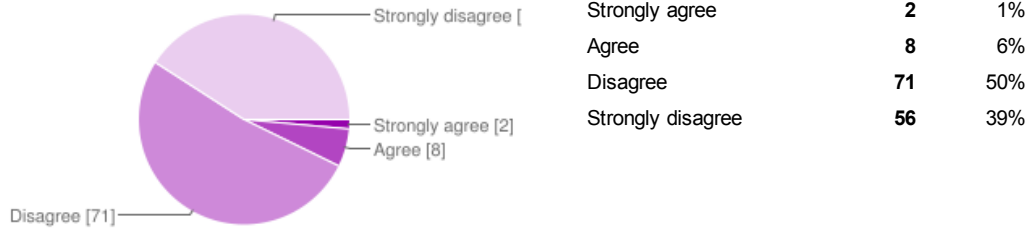

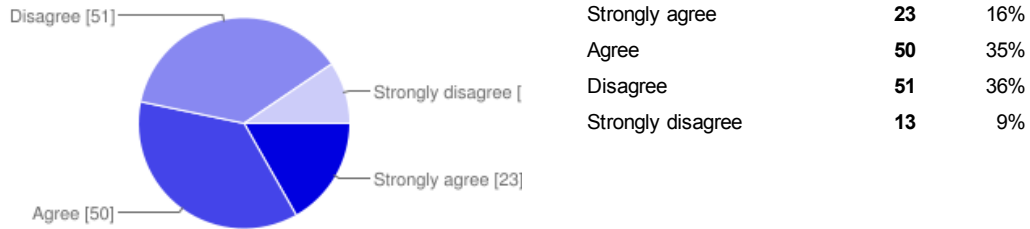

**29. Education institutions which give away teaching materials freely will lose their competitive advantage (e.g., reduced student registrations).**



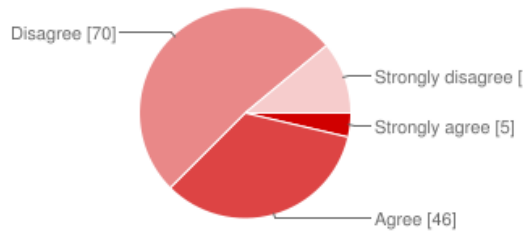
