The original score for the movie was composed by 'Abigail Mead' – a pseudonym for Kubrick's daughter Vivian.

The rest of the music in the movie was carefully selected by Kubrick from 1962 until 1968. Much of this music gives a cynical tone to the action taking place. For example the Mickey Mouse Club Theme being sung by the troops at the end of the film. One particularly choice of Kubrick's was to use the track *Surfin' Bird* for the Marine's first combat scene. The euphoric tone of the music mirrors that seen in the marine's face when he shoots the two Viet Cong.
